**Who are Entitled to Vote in Idaho.**  
Section 1st of the Territorial act on elections, page 683 of the revised statutes reads as follows:  
"That all male inhabitants over the age of twenty-one years shall be entitled to vote at any election for delegate to congress, and for territorial, district, county, and precinct officers; provided they shall be citizens of the United States, and shall have resided in the Territory four months and in the county thirty days where they offer to vote, next preceding the day of election."  
This requires full citizenship. But it overlooks the law of congress regarding eligibility to vote in the territories, because congress in the following sections forbids the legislature of the territorial passing such restriction as full citizenship, and hence the above section of our territorial act in violation is inoperative and void. We quote in full, sections 1859 and 1869 of the revised statutes of the United States in regard to eligibility to vote in all the territories, and these sections are the pertinent law upon the subject, and should be observed by all judges of election in the different precincts throughout the territory at all elections.

In the years 1874 and '75 the total tax collected was \$11,919.20, of this amount \$4,766.08 was paid to the Territory, \$3,177.00 was paid to the school fund and \$3,976.12 was paid to the salaries of county officers, court expenses, etc.

In 1876 and '77 taxes amounted to \$8,689.56. The Territory (Democrat) got \$3,288.88, the school fund got \$2,177.00, leaving for the whole county the amount of \$3,223.68.
