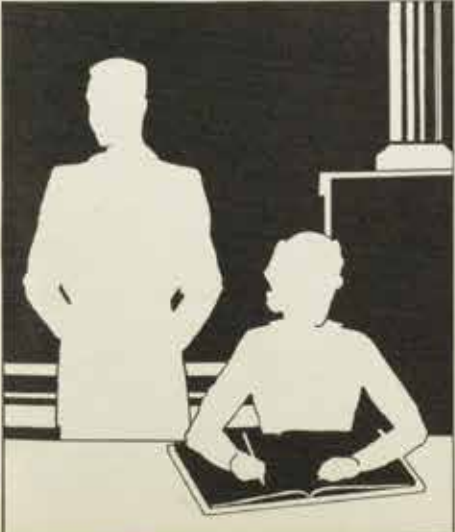
IN 1933 the students of the high school chose as their emblem, that of the dragon. We have retained all the old goals and have added to them, both in scholastic and athletic achievements.

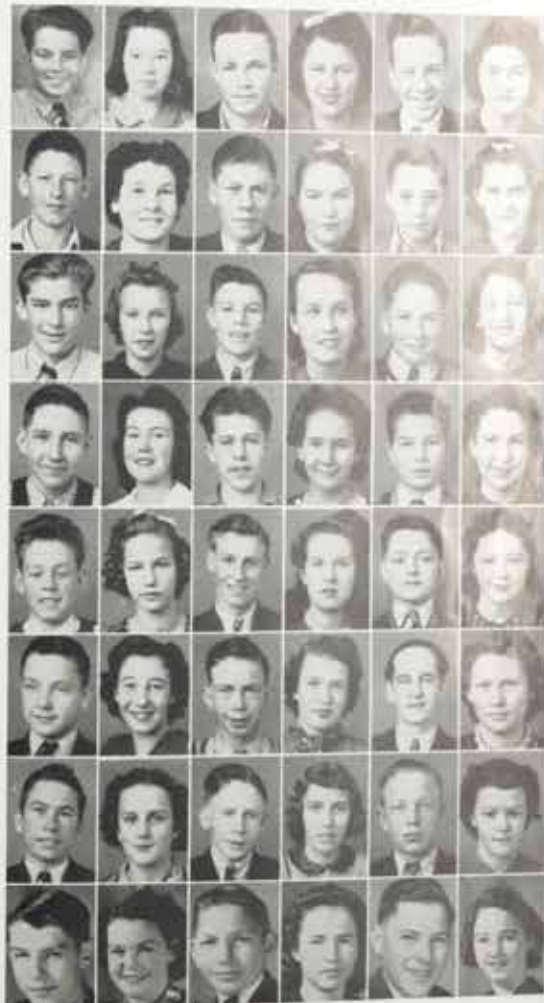
