Constructed in 1899, school was first convened in this building in 1900 and continued for 52 years until it was torn down in 1953 to make way for the present elementary school. Consisted of thirteen classrooms and combination office/bookroom.

The first schools in Oneida County

Schools were organized soon after the arrival of the Mormons into the valley. Facilities were poor, and the students met in various buildings, such as: upstairs in Vanderwood's store, community log meeting house, opera house, Mormon First Ward building, Presbyterian Church, and the Reorganized Church. By 1870 efforts were made to bring the schools under formal public direction. A school district was organized in Oneida County, with a county superinten-

dent and trustees. On February 18, 1881, Congress granted seventy-two sections of public land to the territory of Idaho for school purposes.

The teaching of sectarian doctrines and particular political views was definitely forbidden. Teaching wages ranged from ten dollars in agricultural districts to seventy-five

dollars a month in the mining regions. Malad Valley, being an agricultural area, was relatively low in

The other settlements in the valley established local schools in which the children were provided with some means of education.

Let us root for old Malad High.


Let every heart sing

Start of the 'M' mountain

Very few people have entered Malad Valley and not seen the large white "M" up on the mountain. An actual date for the creation of the "M" hasn't been found, but sources say it was created around the start of the high school, which was built in 1921.

A "M" Day used to be held annually. An except from a 1925 yearbook describes an "M" Day.

"Both the boys and girls of the M.H.S. showed much interest in making the annual "m" day a success. Every boy did his part no matter whether he was small or large, by carrying the white wash up the steep, rocky mountain to give the "M" its annual polish.

"The girls also helped y staying at the school house and preparing a tempting lunch for the boys when they returned. Both boys and girls were well paid for their labors by seeing the snow-white "M" standing alone upon the mountain peek, silently praising the industry and loyalty of the school."

MHS becomes the 'Dragons'

According to Homer Williams, retired Executive Director of the Idaho High School Activities Association and former Malad resident, Malad High School athletic teams got to be known as the "Dragons" quite by accident.

It started, he said, many years ago when a community baseball team he ws playing on got a chance to buy some baseball uniforms at a "real bargain."

Homer said that when the uniforms arrived and the troup opened up the box, they soon discovered why the price had been so good. The word "Dragons" was printed on each one.

Because they had been given such a good price on the uniforms and because they needed them, the team decided to keep the uniforms, and with the result, of course, being that the community baseball team beame known as the "Malad Dragons."

A couple of years after the baseball team too on the name, the studentbody of Malad High School adoped the "Dragons" as their official mascot symbol.






