What Government? We have always been in favor of a full fledged elective Republican form of government for Territories as well as for the States.

We believe that a change of the system of Territorial government would be much better for the settlers of the territories. The present system of a division of Territorial government between the United States and the voters of the territory, it seems to us, is burdensome to the people and detrimental to the settlement of the territory.

Why was the United States control of the entire territorial government upon a plan similar to that now in operation in the District of Columbia where three commissioners appointed by the President and confirmed by the senate, have all powers necessary for the complete government of that district which its population of nearly 300,000 people.

Such a plan would save the expense of elections, it would save the expense of a territorial Legislature, it would insure always a good class of local officers and would do away with the present system of collection of taxes, and save to the people of each territory, lowering the rate of taxation. Local strife would end, a higher grade of local and national officers would be the result, a higher order of school, and a better school system would be secured. And there are numerous other reasons why it would be an improvement upon the present system.

TELEGRAPHIC.

The New York Count-Mahone, of Virginia.

The anxiety expressed in many quarters, concerning the threatened attempt to defeat Garfield's election by showing that the vote of New York, has been effectually disposed of, E. R. Apper, from the State Democratic Committee, disclaiming any support to any such proposition, and by the apparently well authenticated declaration of Gen. Hancock that he is totally opposed to the agitation, and believes Garfield will be elected. It is now believed that the minority of the agitation will receive no encouragement from the influential leaders of the movement to invalidate the legality of the vote of the State of New York, for Garfield and Arthur, will not amount to anything more than a feeble minority against the mass of the people, and will not become ridiculous.

General Mahone, Senator elect from Virginia, arrived in Washington last night and was today interviewed with very small parties. In reply to the question what will be his future position in politics, he said that he would let himself know. There is no more intimate friend, pointing to Collector Brady, of Petersburg, and he does not even know his position. If you will find exactly how I stand and let me know, I will give you \$10,000. Notwithstanding his factiously creative flavor there have been several indications to-day that he contemplates an alliance with the Republicans. Collector Brady who is his most intimate friend and who is here from Virginia, is a strong Republican. Gen. Mahone since his arrival last night, has been visited by Democrats and not by Democrats. He was in conference with the prominent Gen. Gorham and immediately after the manifestation of interest with the reporter he went to the rooms with Collector Brady and Mr. A. M. Clay to carry out a meeting which had been pre-arranged by Collector Brady. Gorham said to-day, after a talk with him, that in his opinion Gen. Mahone would act with the Republicans rather than with the Democrats.

A Grave Plot. In this city there is an undertaking establishment on one side of the street, and just opposite a marble yard and tombstone establishment with a doctor shop not far away of course. The man that sells the wooden caskets is a Republican, while the dealer in marble happens to be a Democrat, if there are really any Democrats now. Just before the election they made a bet, and as money was not plentiful the dealer in marble offered to buy the marble yard and tombstone establishment for the same value. The marble man determined if he won to procure a hearse and haul the marble through the streets as a feature of the Democratic ratification that was to be held. Add now the Republican winner proposed to have a hearse in the streets the following inscription: "Here lies the Democratic party—as it always did. 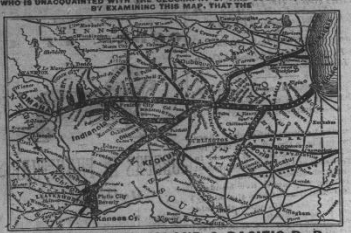
