India's Civilization

Capt Jim at the head of a band of squaws and papoose, poles, poles and their jacked venison, strapped on their ponies, and topped off with a bundle of dry blankets rolled around a lively papoose, arrived in town on Sunday last, and went to their camping grounds just above town, on Oxford creek. There is not much evidence of civilization yet surrounding these poor Bancock representatives, a certain civilization 'surrounding this tribe for the past 16 years, seems not to have made much of an impression upon them. The old Bancks as the males are termed by our people, still insist upon the squaws doing the work, and in return receive all they eat, they can get that much after the hand and master has dined.

Moving camp is truly one of hard times for the squaws.

All the tribe of Banocks and Shoshone Indians are presided over by one big chief, but there are divisions, and subdivisions, presided over by subordinate chiefs.

Old Jim is chief of a small band of related to him some say. Likewise Jim is a polygamist and has two or three wives, who each have a litter or two of papooses, together with their "wisters and coulars and aunts" make up a small tribe of their own.

Jim has a ranch, that is a potato patch on Port Neuf where he bosses his squaws during summer time, but when Buffalo time comes Jim issues an order to 'squaw no to prepare to get to the happy hunting ground.

Squaw no immediately sets about getting every thing ready for the trip and all the rest of the squaws lend a helping hand by getting the simple wardrobe of their Black chief ready for travel. Jim's wardrobe consists of an extra leggings and boots, and a blanket or Buffalo robe. The squaws take down their wigwags, strap them to the ponies, and when all is ready, old Jim who has been for some time planning himself in his saddle and ears, neither looking to the left or right until he approaches the camp for the night, he will await the coming of his caravan, which he knows is not far away, and sit in his saddle perhaps until the pony squaws have put up the tents and are ready to un saddle his pony, when he will talk and partake of the coffee or smoke his pipe until the papooses, dogs, and squaws are slithering around the dying embers of a sage brush fire, when he will content himself with the dogs and gaze off into the land of dreams.

This is a fair example of their every day romantic life. The poor squaws are such abused animals, and yet they seem to be satisfied with their lot. Jim says his squaws are now upon some little creek or on the borders of some marsh and with their traps they will soon clear the surrounding country of muskrats and Beaver, the squaws attending to their traps, and preparing the furs for market. The Bancks will then march off to the market store and sell the furs and take charge of the proceeds.
